FORENSIC SCIENTISTS IN TRAINING ?

Students in Mrs. Christine Mathieu's science classes had a fun filled project that produced some interesting results. The students were given owl pellets to take apart. Owls swallow their prey whole. They digest what they need and what remains is released in the form of a pellet. The pellets are formed from fur and bone fragments. Using a template of different critters, students tried to piece together what was contained in the pellets. Skulls, pelvic bones, rib bones and other skeletal remains helped students decide what animal the owl had for dinner. In some cases there was more than one animal in the pellet. Interesting and educational at the same time is how this project can be described.
